## Activity 15. Professional bodies and your future

### **Aims**

The aim of this activity is to encourage the students to explore some of the services and advantages offered to members of professional bodies.

## **Activity**

Although at this stage in their careers few students may have had any contact with professional bodies, as they develop their careers this is something they are likely to need to use. All of the information they require should be available via the websites or in promotional literature. In addition to just finding the information, hopefully students will spend some time exploring the organisation and become more familiar with the services available to them. Once they have found the information they should ask someone who is a member to briefly outline some of the positive points of membership.
